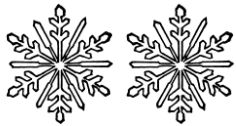

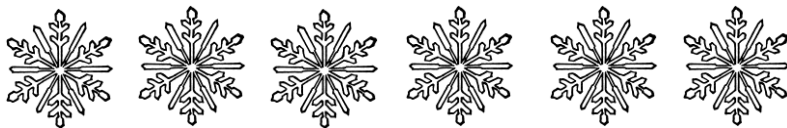
Happy Holidays!

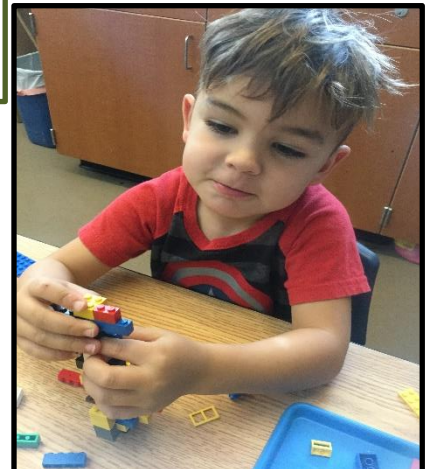
